
Worker's Group Living Quarters

1. WHEN will my facility be counted?



2. HOW will my facility be counted? *

Includes facilities such as dormitories, bunkhouses, and similar types of group living arrangements for agricultural and non-agricultural workers. This category also includes facilities that provide a full-time, year-round residential program offering a vocational training and employment program that helps young people 16-to-24 years old learn a trade, earn a high school diploma or GED and get help finding a job.

*NOTE: Examples include group living quarters at migratory farm worker camps, construction worker camps, Job Corps centers, federal/state law enforcement academies, fire academies, and vocational training facilities. Staff living at this type of Group Quarter (GQ) who do not have any other usual residence elsewhere are counted in the same GQ as the other residents.

3. WHAT can I do to help?



Identify

Special instructions and unique needs of worker's GQs in your community and share this information with Census staff.



Coordinate

Work with Census Bureau staff to ensure receipt of the most updated list of worker's GQs and their Points-of-Contact.



Invite

Census Staff to your meetings to present updates.



Identify

Worker's Group Quarters and share this information using the GQ & TL Add Template.



Recruit

Help the Census Bureau recruit staff who have worked with this population.



Inform

Those living in worker's GQs when/how they will be counted and explain why an accurate Census count is important.
